5 min	Brainstorm the names of the wives of the Holy Prophet (saw) known by the converts	There were 12 wives in total. The converts aren't expected to know all details about each of them, but they should by the end of the lesson gain knowledge of Hazrat Khadija (ra) and Hazrat Ayesha (ra) at least.	
25 min	Provide the Converts with a template table (appended below) Secretary to read out facts and the Convert should identify where it belongs in the template table (appended below)	An alternative is for the Convert to fill out the table as the passage is being read out or fill it out themselves and check together as a group	Pg. 129 - 136

APPENDIX: TOPIC: EXEMPLARY MUSLIM WOMEN – WIVES OF THE HOLY PROPHET (SAW)

NAME	BACKGROUND / REASON FOR MARRIAGE	SIGNIFICANT FACTS
Hazrat Khadijah (ra)	Widowed twice before	<p>First wife</p> <p>15 years older than the Holy Prophet (saw)</p> <p>Had living children from previous marriages</p> <p>Wealthy businesswoman Gave wealth freely to her husband</p> <p>Passed away in the 'Year of Sorrow'</p>
Hazrat Aishah (ra)	<p>After the death of Hazrat Khadijah (ra)</p> <p>Dream of a green handkerchief with Hazrat Aishah (ra)'s image on it</p>	<p>Nikah done when young but Hazrat Aishah (ra) did not begin her marital life until much later</p> <p>Daughter of Hazrat Abu Bakr (ra)</p> <p>Only wife born as a Muslim</p> <p>Blessed with dreams and glad tidings e.g. three moons falling into her lap – fulfilled when the Holy Prophet (saw), Hazrat Abu Bakr (ra) and Hazrat Umar (ra) buried in her house.</p> <p>Excellent scholar of Islam</p>
Hazrat Saudah (ra)	<p>After death of Hazrat Khadijah (ra)</p> <p>Widow</p> <p>Poor</p>	<p>Nikkah at the same time as Hazrat Aishah (ra) but marital life commenced immediately</p>
Hazrat Hafsa (ra)	Widow - first husband died in Battle of Badr	<p>Daughter of Hazrat Umar (ra)</p> <p>Educated – personally annotated Quran used by Hazrat Uthman (ra) when he made copies for standardisation</p>

NAME	BACKGROUND / REASON FOR MARRIAGE	SIGNIFICANT FACTS
Hazrat Zaynab bint Khuzaimah (ra)	Widow – first husband was a cousin of the Holy Prophet (saw) who died in the Battle of Uhud	Passed away a few months after nikkah aged 30
Hazrat Umi Salmah (ra)	Widow – first husband died of wounds sustained in Battle of Uhud	Advanced in age Pioneer Muslim woman – educated other Muslim women Related many ahadith
Hazrat Juwairiyah (ra)	Widow Daughter of a chief of Banu Mustaliq (tribe ally of the Quraish)	Marriage helped forge an alliance between Muslims and Banu Mustaliq
Hazrat Zaynab bint Jahsh (ra)	Cousin of the Holy Prophet (saw)	Very generous
Hazrat Umme Habibah (ra)	Widow Daughter of Abu Sufyan – an enemy of Islam and chief of Makkah	
Hazrat Safiyah (ra)	Daughter of the chief of Banu Nadir tribe of the Jews	
Hazrat Maimoonah (ra)	Huwazain tribe Sister in law of uncle of the Holy Prophet (saw)	
Hazrat Maria Qibtiah (ra)	Coptic maiden gift sent by the ruler of Egypt	Bore a son – Ibrahim although he died at 18 months
