
#### **Guide for Parents**

#### Asalaam O Alaikum!

Dear children,

Today we will be learning about Hazrat Shuaib<sup>as</sup>.

Have you ever heard of Hazrat Shuaibas before?



Did you know?

Hazrat Shuaib<sup>as</sup> is mentioned in many places in the Holy Qur'an and the Hebrew Bible!

## Who was Hazrat Shuaibas?

Hazrat Shuaib (as) شيب (Shu'aib) was the name of a non-Israelite Prophet who lived before Hazrat Musa(as).

Some commentators think that Hazrat Shuaib(as) was the father-in-law of Hazrat Musa(as) and that Hazrat Musa(as) had gone to live with him after he had killed an Israelite. The Bible, however, gives the name of the father-in-law of Moses as Jethro. Now Jethro and Hazrat Shuaib(as) cannot be the same person, nor was Hazrat Shuaib(as) the father-in-law of Hazrat Musa(as). The following facts support this view:

- ❖ Hazrat Shuaib(as) has been mentioned in the Holy Quran at several places and so has the father-in-law of Hazrat Musa(as), but nowhere in the Quran is there the slightest hint that Hazrat Shuaib(as) and the father-in-law of Hazrat Musa(as) were the same person nor has the fatherin-law of Moses anywhere been referred to as a Prophet of God.
- Holy Quran clearly states in Chapter 7, verse 104 that Hazrat Musa(as) was raised as a Prophet after the destruction of the people of Midian, which definitely shows that they were not contemporaries.

- Holy Quran also states that Hazrat Shuaib(as) appeared not long after Hazrat Lut(as), so he could not be a contemporary of Hazrat Musa(as).
- ❖ If Hazrat Shuaib(as) had been the contemporary and father-in-law of Hazrat Musa(as), he would not have failed to refer to the destruction of Pharaoh and his people, which had taken place only recently, when he had referred to the destruction of the peoples of Hazrat Nuh(as), Hazrat Hud(as) and Hazrat Salih(as) in Surah Al-Ara'f -verse 90, but he did not do so.

The Holy Quran speaks of Hazrat Musa (as) as having been raised after Hazrat Shuaib (as). As Hazrat Shuaib (as) has been mentioned in chapter Al-Araf, verse 86 as the "brother" of Midian, the inference is inevitable that he was a descendant of Hazrat Ibrahim(as).

Hazrat Musa<sup>25</sup> or Moses

In the Hebrew Bible (Midian) was Abraham's (Hazrat Ibrahim) son. His descendants dwelt in the north of the Hijaz. They were all called Midian, in accordance with ancient usage. Or it may be that originally they were called "Banu Midian" (children of Midian) but these words later became abbreviated into Midian. metropolis of these people was also called Midian, which itself may be an abbreviation of some such name as Duri Midian (the houses of Midian). This town was situated on the Gulf of 'Akabah, on the Arabian coast, at a distance of some six or seven miles from the sea. This is why in some ancient books of geography it is mentioned as a sea port, while in others it is shown as an inland town.

The trade caravans going from Arabia to Egypt passed through it. There are still several small townships known as Midian, but the original town no longer exists. The descendants of Midian lived in the north of the Hijaz and it is they who built this town. It was hither that Hazrat Musa(as) fled for refuge when Pharaoh and his nobles sought to kill him and it was in the neighbourhood of Midian that he stayed with the Israelites after crossing the Red Sea. The fact that the word of Midian مريد possesses a close resemblance to Medina, the town of the Holy Prophet (sas). It is said that the most prominent evil of the Midian people was their unfair practice in measuring and weighing.

The following important facts about the people of Hazrat Shuaib(as) also emerge from different verses of the Holy Quran:

- Like the Holy Prophet (sas), it was chiefly at the hands of the people of his town that Hazrat Shuaib(as) met with opposition.
- People of Hazrat Shuaib(as) not only practised idolatry, but were also fraudulent in their dealings with one another.
- They were well-to-do and prosperous people.
- They had adopted the calling of the road and were given to plundering and dacoity.

As these people lived on the trade route to Egypt, they used to plunder the caravans which passed by that way. This inference receives further support from the fact that near Midian there was a wood which was peopled by the descendants of Dedan, a nephew of Midian, being the child of another son of Abraham from Keturah (Gen. 25:3). These people are referred to in the Quran i.e. the People of the Wood اصحاب الایکة (15:79 & 26:177) and Hazrat Shuaib (as) preached to them as he preached to the people of Midian (26:178-192). From 15:80 it appears that this wood or jungle lay on a trade route, so it served as a good hiding place for the people of Midian to plunder travellers.

## Mission of Hazrat Shuaib(as)

Through the stories of Hazrat Musa(as) and Hazrat Shuaib(as), we learn that Hazrat Shuaib(as) was one of the few truly good and upright men of Midian. The people of Midian were deceiving one another and were not following the correct path.

Mission of Hazrat Shuaib (as) was to call his people to worship God alone and to follow His commandments. He tried to do so by reminding them of the graces and favours bestowed on them by God, but they did not listen to him.

Surah Al - Ara'af, verse 86 tells us that Hazrat Shuaib(as) guided his people:

- To worship Allah as there is no god other than Him.
- To give full measure and full weight
- To diminish not unto people their things
- Not to create disorder in the earth after it has been set in order.

He tried to do so by reminding them of the graces and favours bestowed on them by God, but they did not listen to him Allah tells us about the disbelievers in detail in chapter 7 (Surah Al-Ara'af) and Chapter 11 (Surah Hud) of Holy Quran.

When Hazrat Shuaib (as) tried to call his people to worship God alone and to follow His commandments, the chief men of his people, who were arrogant said that they will send Hazrat Shuaib (as) and his believers out of the town unless they return to their religion. To this Hazrat Shuaib (as) replied,

"If we returned to your religion after Allah has saved us therefrom, we would indeed admit that we had been forging a lie against Allah" (7:90)

Hazrat Shuaib (as) then prayed,

'O our Lord, decide Thou between us and between our people with truth, and Thou art the Best of those who decide.'

Holy Quran teaches us about the practice of disbelievers that due to their power and wealth, they never listen to any request however reasonable. So the opponents of Hazrat Shuaib (as) said:

"There is no need for anyone to judge between us. We ourselves can judge and our verdict is that, only he who follows our religion will be allowed to live with us."

Hazrat Shuaib (as) continued to call his people towards the right path. But the disbelievers mocked and did not follow the commandments of Allah.

Hazrat Shuaib (as) then went on to warn his people that they were likely to suffer a similar fate to the people of Hazrat Nuh(as), Hazrat Hud (as) and Hazrat Saleh(as).

Destruction was the end product of their disobedience. So the earthquake seized them. The disbelievers had threatened Hazrat Shuaib (as) with expulsion from their town, if he did not not return to their religion (7:89).

They forgot that it was not their but God's town So, in order to demonstrate that it was not they but God Who was the Master of the land, He so utterly destroyed them, and all signs of their habitations and dwellings were so completely effaced that it appeared as if they had never dwelt therein.

That was indeed a fitting punishment for those who proudly called God's land their own and threatened to drive God's Messenger away therefrom.

This story teaches us that throughout history, good and intelligent men have always believed that force should not be used in matters relating to conscience.

Hazrat Shuaib (as) like many Prophets before, and after him, taught his followers how to achieve nearness to God, and be successful in life with God's help.

Through the beautiful examples of our Prophets, we can learn many things that we should try to apply to our own lives.

May Allah enable us to follow in the steps of our Prophets and do the things that please Him.
