Masih Al- Maud Day - The Promised Messiah Day

What is Masih Maud Day and why do we celebrate it?

Saturday 23rd March 1889 was the momentous day when Hazrat Mirza Ghulam Ahmad, the Promised Messiah^(as), accepted the hands of forty faithful servants and founded the community which he called 'The Ahmadiyya Muslim Community'.

Hazrat Hakim Maulvi Noor al-Din^(ra) was the first person to have the honour of taking the first Bai'at. This was a revolutionary yet a very modest beginning to a new chapter in the history of Islam.

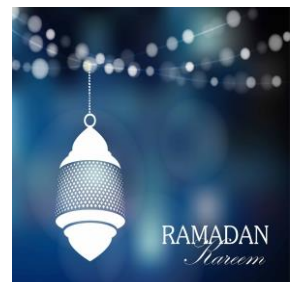
