

Remember

- -concentrate on attaining new skills and utilising the ones you already have
- quality over quantity i.e. Nice fabrics, cotton mix yarn, accurate stitching

Materials

- Upcycle materials you already have for practicing and learning
- Raise funds for materials
- 'Donation day' ask local lajna to 'donate' any equipment and materials they no longer need i.e. knitting needles, crochet hooks, extra wool and yarns, leftover materials, embroidery hoops, scissors
- Contact central team if cannot acquire materials needed

Next steps...

- 1. I&H secretaries will find out what skills their lajna have and choose what items can be made by them
- 2. Khidmate Khalq secretaries can approach hospitals, care homes, shelters, etc. and ask what is needed and inform what can be provided
 - 3. I&H secretaries oversee those items being made
 - 4. KK secretaries deliver items

NOTE: Every majalis will be different in how they go about this project but secretaries should work together with sadr to make the best plan.
