1. STUDY OF THE HOLY QUR'AN: (TALEEM WORKSHOP)

This month we begin the study of Surah Al-Ghashiyah (Chapter 88) of the Holy Quran with Commentary.

ACTIVITY: As we study Verses 1-4 of the Surah this month, let us reflect on the following questions:

What are the possible interpretations of the 'Overwhelming calamity' in verse 1?
According to verses 3 and 4 of the Surah, who will be the ones whose faces will be downcast, tolling and weary on the Day of Reckoning?

2. WHAT IS SALAT? (GENERAL MEETING)

(Essence of Islam Volume II)

The Promised Messiah (as) has explained to us in such beautiful words the true meaning of Salat. He (as) states, "What is Salat? It is a supplication addressed to the Lord of Honour without which a person cannot be truly alive, nor can he procure any means of security and happiness."

ACTIVITY: As we study and reflect on the subject of Salat, in light of the words of the Promised Messiah (as), what do we learn about the means to achieving delight in our Salat? How does a true believer build a deep and meaningful connection with Salat and how does this help one to strengthen their bond with Allah Taala?

3. HADITH (GENERAL MEETING)

Good Treatment of Neighbours

Hazrat Aisha (ra) narrated that the Holy Prophet (saw) said,

عَنْ عَائِشَةَ رَضِيَ اللَّهُ عَنْهَا، عَنِ النَّبِيِّ صَلَّى اللَّهُ عَلَيْهِ وَسَلَّمَ قَالَ مَا زَالَ جِبْرِيلُ يُوصِينِي بِالْجَارِ،
حَتَّى ظَنَنْتُ أَنَّهُ سَيُورَثُهُ۔

“Gabriel recommended to me good treatment of the neighbour so often that I started thinking that he would perhaps declare him the heir and successor.”

ACTIVITY: The Holy Prophet (saw) laid great emphasis on the treatment of neighbours. What do we learn from this Hadith on the kind treatment of neighbours? How can we ensure we fulfil our responsibilities towards our neighbours? Why are neighbours given such high regard in Islam?

4. FIRST CONDITION OF BAI'AT (GENERAL MEETING)

As we begin our new Syllabus from this Term, an area that we will be focusing is the Ten Conditions Of Baiat that have been explained in great detail by Beloved Huzur (aba) in the book Conditions of Bai'at and Responsibilities of an Ahmadi.

We start this Term by studying the First Condition of Bai'at: “That he/she shall abstain from Shirk (association of any partner with God) right up to the day of his/her death.”

ACTIVITY: As you reflect on this First Condition of Bai'at, consider the following questions:

- In the Book Conditions of Bai'at and Responsibilities of an Ahmadi, Beloved Huzur (aba) explains to us the Diverse Forms of Shirk – what are some examples of this that we may encounter in our everyday lives?
- What did Hadrat Khalifatul Masih I (ra) state in regards to what constitutes Shirk?
- What are some of the challenges that one needs to overcome to ensure they abstain from Shirk?

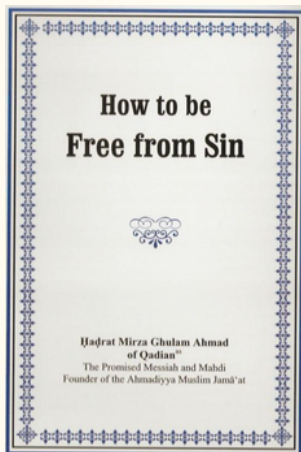
ACTIVITY: As you study pages 7-11 of the Book, reflect on the following questions: What were the two phases in which the Promised Messiah (as) would appear ?
