Community Project

Description: Lajna members are encouraged to actively participate in practical community service projects that reflect the true spirit of Khidmat-e-Khalq. Each month, members should come together to contribute to the betterment of their local environment and society through organised initiatives such as cleaning local mosques, supporting community clean-up efforts, maintaining public spaces, assisting care homes, and taking part in local service days. The goal is to serve humanity through visible, hands-on actions that promote cleanliness, care, and compassion, while strengthening a sense of unity and responsibility within the wider community.

Community Project Ideas for Lajna

- Lajna can organise regular mosque care initiatives, ensuring that local mosques are kept clean, welcoming, and well-maintained.

This can include light cleaning and seasonal maintenance such as decluttering and refreshing shared spaces.

- Members can take part in neighbourhood or park-based projects

This includes litter picking, gardening, tree planting, maintaining flower beds, and supporting local council initiatives.

- Spring clean-ups can also be organised to keep shared spaces pleasant and safe
- Another meaningful initiative is engaging with care homes or community centres

Lajna members can arrange visits and organise activities such as arts and crafts, reading sessions, or light exercise. Preparing small care packages for residents or support staff can further spread kindness and appreciation.

- Lajna can expand their efforts by supporting wider community needs such as helping at food banks, assisting in community kitchens, or supporting local events

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- Members can distribute refreshments during community events, help at charity walks, or offer volunteer support at local schools and libraries
- Additionally, members can take part in beautification and sustainability project
- This can include community gardening, recycling drives, and awareness campaigns on keeping neighbourhoods clean.
- Supporting initiatives like “adopt-a-street” or maintaining small local areas regularly can create a lasting, visible difference and reflect a strong sense of civic responsibility.

Helping Your Neighbours

Description: Secretaries are to devise plans and encourage Lajna members to adopt a proactive and compassionate approach towards supporting their neighbours, reflecting the true teachings of Islam. Emphasis should be placed on building genuine relationships, offering practical help, and ensuring that those living nearby feel cared for and supported. This includes regular check-ins, assisting with everyday needs, and being mindful of any difficulties neighbours may be facing. The goal is to create a community where kindness is visible, consistent, and inclusive of all, regardless of background or faith.

The Holy Qur'an reminds us:

"And worship Allah and associate naught with Him, and show kindness to parents, and to kindred, and orphans, and the needy, and to the neighbour that is a kinsman and the neighbour that is a stranger..."
(Surah An-Nisa, 4:37)

The Holy Prophet ﷺ said:

(Sahih Bukhari)

Ideas for Implementation

- Introduce yourself to neighbours and maintain friendly contact
- Share small acts of kindness such as meals, gifts, or helpful gestures
- Check on elderly or vulnerable neighbours regularly
- Offer support during times of illness, hardship, or busy periods
- Maintain cleanliness and avoid causing inconvenience or disturbance
- Participate in or initiate small neighbourhood efforts that build unity
- Encourage every member to **connects with at least one neighbour** each month (visit, call, or check-in)
- Offer practical help where needed (shopping, meals, small errands)
- Be mindful of neighbours' circumstances and respond with empathy and discretion
- Promote a culture of **respect, peace, and consideration** within neighbourhoods
- Encourage members to represent Islamic values through kindness and good conduct
- If ever a neighbour is in any difficulty, remember to pray for them!
